About the Program

All students are required to complete a Work-Based Learning experience during their career at the school. The SEA WORKS Program is a work-based learning program for students age 16 and above, consisting of 150 to 600 hours of paid, school-supervised work experience, supported by related in-school instruction in a specific career & technical discipline. Students may earn $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 units of credit towards a CTE sequence, depending upon the specific sequence. The program is supervised by the Work-Based learning coordinator who serves as a liaison between employer, student, and parent as well as providing job placement and worksite visits.
